Presented by Jo Lunn. Jo is a registered Psychologist who has been working in the Alcohol and Other Drug treatment for over 25 years. Jo works with people who struggle with chug or alcohol issues and provides consultancy around designing and implementing organizational change with a particular focus on improving version delivery for clients with co-existing ADD and complete, needs (e.g. mental health sauses, cognitive implaiment, homelessness, involvement in the criminal justice system, Indigenous and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse status).

As currently holds Co-chair positions with both the Agency of Chrical Intervaliant Drug and Alcohol Network) and the Practice Leadership Group (NADA), the focus of both groups being the fostering and development of innovative treatment for clients with ACD issues. In 2014 Jo was awarded by NADA with the 2014 NGO Cutstanding Contribution to the Industry Award, primarily in recognition for her achievements in her current role at WHOS.
