Principal's Message

Welcome to a very busy Week 6! This week, we look forward to welcoming parents to our Meet the Teacher afternoon. Each classroom will be open for 1 parent per student to attend. Please make sure you bring your Visitor Acknowledgement Form that was sent home last week. Teachers will have spare copies in their classroom if it has been misplaced. It is important that you follow all instructions on the note and any given to you on the afternoon to ensure we are following our Covid-19 Safety Plan.

The school will also be participating in Clean Up Australia Day on Friday. A note was sent home with information regarding the areas that each class will attend. Please make sure your child brings in their permission note, gardening gloves and hat to participate.

Class Dojo

Class Dojo is an effective form of communication between teachers and the parents/carers. The whole school adopted Class Dojo during Home Learning last year. It works best when all people are aware of why and how it is to be used effectively. Please see the expectations of Class Dojo as a communication tool below.

Teachers:

- communicate in a respectful and positive manner.
- Respond in a timely manner this may take up to 24 hrs to respond with an expectation to respond between 8:30am 3:30pm.
- send reminders for school events on Class Dojo.
- celebrate learning through photos and work samples.

Parents/Carers:

- communicate in a respectful and positive manner.
- engage in short, simple communication to the teacher. eg clarifying questions renotes or reminders for the classroom.
- call the office to request a phone call to discuss more complex communications egif a student is having difficulty in a social situation or in the classroom.

Stewart House Donations

Every year 1,700 public school children attend the Stewart House safe haven next to Curl Curl beach at no cost to their parents or carers. During a 12-day stay, they are provided with dental, optical, hearing, medical screening and treatment.

Children participate in educational programs and excursions designed to develop their social and emotional skills, build self-esteem and improve their overall wellbeing.

This experience provides children with a much-needed break from their current circumstance. Our children are inspired to see beyond the present and to have real hope and positive aspirations for their future.

This year, Stewart House are having a Donation Drive to raise the funds to keep this program running. An envelope was sent home for a \$2 donation. If you are able to donate, please send the envelope back to school by Friday, 19th March. All donations will be sent to Stewart House before the end of the term.

Kiss and Drop Zone

In an effort to make the Kiss and Drop zone a safe and well functioning pick up and drop off point, we need parents to use the zone as a continuous line of traffic. You can assist in the following ways;

- drive to the front of the zone for pick up
- follow the car in front to leave the zone to avoid accidents and confusion
- stay with your vehicle, request assistance from a teacher on duty if you cannot find your child
- students need to exit and enter the car from the kerb side
- remind other carers, including grandparents of the rules

Professional Learning – supporting our students and families



Premiers Reading Challenge

Today, the 1st of March, marks the official commencement of the 2021 Premier's Reading Challenge. The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is a state-wide program that aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely.

This year, there is a slight change to the organisation of the PRC at Gerringong Public School. Our K-2 classes will complete their PRC during their library lessons and their reading records will be updated at school by the Teacher Librarian. Our K-2 students will still be encouraged to borrow books from the K-2 PRC list and share these stories with their families to continue to foster a love of reading through quality literature.

Our 3-6 classes are required to read 20 books independently from the 3-4 and 5-6 PRC lists. Over the next few weeks, our primary students will be given explicit instruction showing them how to log their books electronically. They will also receive a paper copy of the reading log to track their reading for the challenge.

The challenge is open to students until Friday 20th August 2021, so we have plenty of time to read and record some great books.


































Stage 3 Canberra Excursion- 2021



A program supporting mothers to raise happy, respectful and connected boys aged 6-8 years old

What happens?

The program is run by a female and male facilitator over six weekly sessions, two hours in length. The first session is attended by the mothers only, while the five remaining have both mothers and their sons, sometimes working together and sometimes doing separate activities all aiming at providing information and tips on how to integrate information into the family's life.

The sessions explore the role of the mother and where parenting skills and ideas come from; emotion regulation; the importance of male role models in a son's life and what masculinity means today. As a group we focus on the developing of a strong, enduring and positive connections between mothers and sons and healthy relationships beyond the family sphere.

Mothers have been asking how they can connect, understand and support their son's development emotionally. How to parent a young boy as a mother and how to raise a respectful boy into a respectful man.

As there are no programs like this in Australia, we developed our own (called Mothers and Sons Program!). It is specifically designed for boys 6-8 years old, as research tells us this is the critical time to teach boys around emotional regulation and respectful behaviour.

Please not this program is not a therapeutic behavioural change program. It is information sharing and support. Limited child minding will be offered.
